Jurisdiction:	Example County
Mitigation Action/Project Title:	Improve coordination of community development and building departments as they relate to the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP)
Background/Issue:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Example County joined the NFIP in 2006 and preliminary Digital Flood Insurance Rate Maps (DFIRMs) are expected to be released in late 2009. • Residents, especially those in special flood hazard areas, will have questions for the County officials following release of the preliminary DFIRMs. • Because the NFIP is new to the County and the requirements are unfamiliar, officials in both departments would benefit from receiving some training with regard to reading the maps and interpreting regulations so that information conveyed to the public is consistent.
Ideas for Integration:	The action supports the 2007 County Land Use Plan, which identified land near the Example River as one location where future residential and commercial development are anticipated in the next decade
Responsible Agency:	Example County Community Development Department
Partners:	FEMA Association of State Floodplain Managers State Water Conservation Board
Potential Funding:	Local building associations Operating budget for staff time
Cost Estimate:	\$1,000 Certified Floodplain manager training \$1,500 printing for local training workshop(s)
Benefits: (Losses Avoided)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Protect people and property from future flood losses • Improve coordination of departments • Avoid potentially costly consequences of noncompliance with NFIP requirements • Avoid future losses for property owners due to flooding if regulations are not adequately understood
Timeline:	Coordinate with the arrival of the DFIRMs , which are due in the County by November 2009
Priority:	This is a top priority action as the mitigation plan identified flooding as the hazard that may lead to the greatest amount of property damage in the future
