MESSAGE:

Heat Stress

- Hydration is critical to the prevention of heat casualties. Drink a balance of water and sports drinks (which replace needed salts and minerals) regularly throughout the day. Do not wait until you have become very thirsty.
 - Take frequent breaks. Rest in a shaded or air conditioned area, when available, and remove body armor if the area is secure.
 - It can take up to several weeks to fully acclimatize. Relief personnel from cooler regions of the country may initially need shorter operational periods and longer rest times.
 - Know your limits and speak up if you believe you are beginning to approach them. Know the signs and symptoms of heat stress and look out for your shipmates.
- Heat stroke – high body temp with red, hot, dry skin (no sweating)
-Heat exhaustion – normal body temp with moist skin and pale or flushed complexion

Contamination and Personal Hygiene

- Avoid direct skin contact with contaminated water to prevent possible illness or infection. Wash as soon as possible after any accidental contamination.
- Avoid hand-to-mouth contact during field operations.
- Wash and/or sanitize your hands regularly, especially after field operations, using the toilet, and before eating.

Animal Bites

- Be cautious and avoid wild and stray animals, snakes, and biting or stinging insects.
- Do not enter structures where uncaged domesticated animals are present.
- Do not rescue animals. Contact the Humane Society at 1-888-773-6489 or 1-800-HUMANE-1 for pet rescue.

- Multiple parts are still being purchased. NESU NOLA and MLCA are coordinating the purchase, receipt and transportation of these parts to the appropriate places in the New Orleans area.
