

LEVERAGING TOOLS FOR CONDUCTING DAMAGE ASSESSMENTS



Leveraging Tools for Conducting Damage Assessments is an 8-hour instructor led, performance-level course that will provide participants with the knowledge necessary to more effectively conduct damage assessments. One of the keys to successful response and recovery efforts is accurate and timely assessments of damages and needs. This training emphasizes collaborative strategies for conducting multi-agency damage assessments, lessons learned in data collection and analysis, and communication of findings to decision makers. Participants will also engage in hands-on applications of both traditional and emerging technologies in damage assessment.

WHO SHOULD TAKE THIS COURSE

This course will bring together governmental and nongovernmental leaders as well as private, nonprofit and faith-based entities active in disaster management, and expose them to the requirements for conducting damage and needs assessments (DANA).
